GARDEN GROVE STUDENTS TO LEAVE FOR ANYANG, SOUTH KOREA APRIL 8

Nine high school students from the Garden Grove Unified School District are headed to Anyang, South Korea. The teens are part of the Sister City Association of Garden Grove annual student exchange program between Garden Grove and its Sister City, Anyang.

The students, along with two chaperones, will leave LAX at 1:10 p.m. on April 8, to begin a 10-day visit to Anyang and surrounding areas, while staying with Korean host families. The group's scheduled activities include meeting with the Mayor and City Council of Anyang, a day at an Anyang high school, a tour of Seoul's areas of interest, and a visit to the South Korean Army Base near the Demilitarized Zone, bordering North Korea.

The Garden Grove City Council will recognize the students at their Community Spotlight presentation on Tuesday, March 23 at 6:30 p.m., in the Community Meeting Center, located at 11300 Stanford Avenue. After the presentation, the students will be treated to a Korean dinner hosted by Flower Pig Restaurant.

The student exchange program promotes mutual cultural understanding and international friendship between Garden Grove and Anyang, South Korea. The Sister City Association of Garden Grove, with financial support from the Garden Grove Community Foundation, Rotary Club of Garden Grove, and Kiwanis Club of Greater Garden Grove sponsors the student exchange program.
